Following the Public Hearing, City Council of Lenoir City met in its regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 P.M. The Mayor and the following Councilmen were present: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler. Gregory Harrison, Amber Scott-Kelso and Maggie Hunt were also present.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Hines to approve the minutes of September 11, 2017 meeting. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/ items on the agenda.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Wampler to adopt an Ordinance establishing a Handicapped Parking Space in front of the residence located at 521 West First Avenue in Lenoir City, Tennessee. Second and Final Reading. Ordinance 2017-09-25-2176

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Shields to adopt a Resolution to accept the revised procurement policy duly adopted by the Tennessee Department of Transportation. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Shields to adopt a Resolution authorizing participation in the TML Pool's James L. Richardson "Driver Safety" Matching Grant Program. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

Resolution 2017-09-25-2176-B.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Johnson to adopt a Resolution amending the time at which City Council meeting are held from 7:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M. starting January 8, 2018. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

Resolution 2017-09-25-2176-C.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Johnson to award the 2018 Street Department Truck to Lenoir City Ford with the lowest bid of: \$28,503.32 and the trade in value of a 2015 Ford pickup \$28,500.00 total cost of the new 2018 \$3.32. The other bid was from Lonnie Cobb Ford \$29,984.00 and the trade in value of a 2015 Ford pickup \$28,017.00 total cost of the new 2018 \$1,967.00. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Simpson and seconded by Shields to award the (2) 2018 police SUV'S to Lenoir City Ford with the only bid of \$30,069.58 each and the trade in value of a 2015 Tahoe \$32,000.00 and 2012 Jeep Cherokee \$11,000.00 total cost of the (2) new 2018 Ford Explorer \$17,139.16. This will be paid out of the Drug Fund. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Shields and seconded by Johnson recommended Dorma USA, Inc. for the installation of additional Handicapped Accessible door openers for the City Hall building for the price of \$3,985.00. Doorway Services & Solutions and Mid-South Automatic did not submit. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/ items not on the agenda.

A motion was made by Wampler and seconded by Simpson to approve all bills and accounts to be paid when properly approved and funds available. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.

A motion was made by Henline and seconded by Johnson to adjourn the September 25, 2017 meeting. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Hines, Johnson, Shields, Simpson, and Wampler voting **AYE**.
