The City Council of Lenoir City met in its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, May 23, 2022 at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Aikens and the following Council Members were present: Henline, Wampler, Shields, and Brandon. Hines and Simpson were Absent. Amber Scott Kelso and LaVonne Barbour were also present.

A motion was made by Wampler and seconded by Brandon to approve the minutes of the May 9, 2022 City Council Meeting. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Wampler, Shields, and Brandon voting **AYE**. Hines and Simpson were **Absent**.

Mayor Aikens announced there will be a Public Hearing at 2:50 P.M., and a Special Called City Council Meeting 3:00 P.M. on Monday, June 13, 2022 at City Hall. The First Reading of the 2022-2023 budget will be on Monday, June 20, 2022, and the Second and Final reading will be held on Monday, June 27, 2022.

Mayor Aikens asked for comments from citizens regarding an item/items on the agenda.

A motion was made by Henline and seconded by Shields to approve State of Tennessee contract pricing for five (5) vehicles to be utilized as COVID Mitigation Response Transport (ARPA Funds). The total cost for four (4) of them (Ford Explorers) from Ford of Murfreesboro (State Contract) is \$135,524.00, the total for lighting and equipment is \$24,952.00, and the labor to install is \$3,800.00. The total cost for one (1) of them (Chevrolet Silverado) from Wilson County Motors (State Contract) is \$44,411.20 (the vehicles will also be outfitted with ventilation and seat systems. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Wampler, Shields, and Brandon voting **AYE**. Hines and Simpson were **Absent**

A motion was made by Brandon and seconded by Shields to approve going to bid for roof replacement at City Hall. The following vote was recorded: Henline, Wampler, Shields, and Brandon voting **AYE**. Hines and Simpson were **Absent**

A motion was made by Wampler and seconded by Brandon to approve bid from Brewster's Services Group for \$139,739.00 for Tree Removal and Infrastructure improvements (ARPA Funds). The following vote was recorded: Henline, Wampler, Shields, and Brandon voting **AYE**. Hines and Simpson were **Absent**


